



How can EU4Health and Horizon Europe programmes improve access to diagnosis, treatment and care for paediatric cancer patients?

Meeting of MEPs Against Cancer (MAC) & Invited Stakeholders 8 September 2020, Online Webinar

The first stakeholder meeting of the MEPs Against Cancer (MAC) interest group at the European Parliament for the legislature 2019-24 looked at how EU policy and funding programmes, specifically the #EU4Health and the #CancerMission, can accelerate action to beat childhood cancer sooner in Europe and beyond.

The meeting was organised by ECL as the MAC Secretariat in partnership with European organisations representing childhood cancer stakeholders: SIOP-Europe, CCI Europe and PanCare. The purpose of the event was to mark Gold September #ChildhoodCancerAwarenessMonth.





The meeting was chaired and moderated by the MAC leadership: Co-Chairs Véronique Trillet-Lenoir (RE, France) and Loucas Fourlas (EPP, Cyprus) and Vice-Chairs Miriam Dalli (S&D, Malta) and Petra De Sutter (Greens/EFA, Belgium). The event also featured panel interventions from MEPs with key roles on the legislative files in question, European Commission officials and a parent and survivor representing CCI-Europe.

4 Key paediatric cancer recommendations for EU4Health Programme:

- Address inequalities in the survival of children and adolescents with cancer across Europe through measures to ensure pan-European accessibility to best practice in diagnostics, treatments and long term follow up:
- -Ensure long-term sustainability of the European Reference Network on Paediatric Cancer (and other ERNs).
- -Introduce a facilitated framework for delivery of practice-changing clinical trials focused on improving standards of care.
- 2. Foster improved access to innovative therapies for children and adolescents with cancer across Europe a population with major unmet needs in an area of relative market failure, by improving the regulatory environment such as the Paedatric Regulation.




















- **3. Facilitate roll-out of appropriate long-term surveillance and care transition structures** specifically formulated for the expanding population of childhood cancer survivors, estimated at around 500,000 in Europe today, based on models such as the Survivorship Passport.
- **4. Foster sustained livelihoods for parents of children with life-threating illnesses including cancer** to uphold children's rights for parental presence throughout their disease by, for instance, empowering appropriately resourced parent and patient organisations.



Prof. Christine Chomienne, Vice-Chair of the European Commission's Mission Board for Cancer, presented the scope, work and draft report of Horizon Europe's Mission for Cancer.



- **3 Key messages concerning childhood cancer research** where strong EU measures need to be launched and their successful implementation monitored:
- 1. **Understand childhood cancer**: spur fundamental research on embryogenesis and childhood immunity.
- 2. **Provide optimised treatment**: spur drug development dedicated to childhood cancers.
- 3. Provide cancer patients and carers an **enhanced quality of life**: create a dedicated survivorship programme for patients and carers.
