## #2: Proudly wear the World Cancer Day buttons and/or the MAC pins, scarfs and ties





### **About World Cancer Day**

World Cancer Day every 4 February is the global uniting initiative led by the Union for International Cancer Control (UICC). By raising worldwide awareness, improving education and catalysing personal, collective and government action, we're working together to reimagine a world where millions of preventable cancer deaths are saved and access to life-saving cancer treatment and care is equal for all – no matter who you are or where you live. Because we believe that cancer isn't just a health issue but a human issue that touches all of us.

Created in 2000, World Cancer Day has grown into a positive movement for everyone, everywhere to unite under one voice to face one of our greatest challenges in history. Each year, hundreds of activities and events take place around the world, gathering communities, organisations and individuals in schools, businesses, hospitals, marketplaces, parks, community halls, places of worship - in the streets and online - acting as a powerful reminder that we all have a role to play in reducing the global impact of cancer.

### About the 2022 theme

The <u>2022-2024 theme</u> places supporters at the heart of the campaign and calls for commitment and action to close the gap in cancer care within and between countries.

2022 is the first year of the 'Close the Care Gap' campaign and it is all about understanding and recognising the inequities in cancer care around the globe. It's about having an open mind, challenging assumptions and looking at the hard facts:

- Inequity in cancer care costs lives.
- People who seek cancer care hit barriers at every turn.
- Income, education, location and discrimination based on ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, age, disability and lifestyle are just a few of the factors that can negatively affect care.
- The gap affects everyone, including you and your loved ones.
- These barriers are not set in stone. They can be changed.

This is the year to question the status quo and help reduce stigma; to listen to the perspectives of the people living with cancer and their communities and let those lived experiences guide our thoughts and actions.

That's how we can begin to imagine a better way of doing things and to build a fairer vision of the future - a future where people live healthier lives and have better access to health and cancer services, no matter where they are born, grow, age, work or live. This World Cancer Day, what will you learn about the gaps in cancer care?
